Our state-of-the-art community hub sits on the Hertfordshire–Stanmore border, surrounded by landscaped courtyards, gardens, meadows, and ancient woodland, with beautiful views across London.

At its heart is the Ronson Family Community Centre, offering a wide range of facilities and activities, including an on-site synagogue, The Adrian Gordon Restaurant, a shop, wellbeing services, and The Zalman and Ruchi Noé Centre supporting people living with dementia.

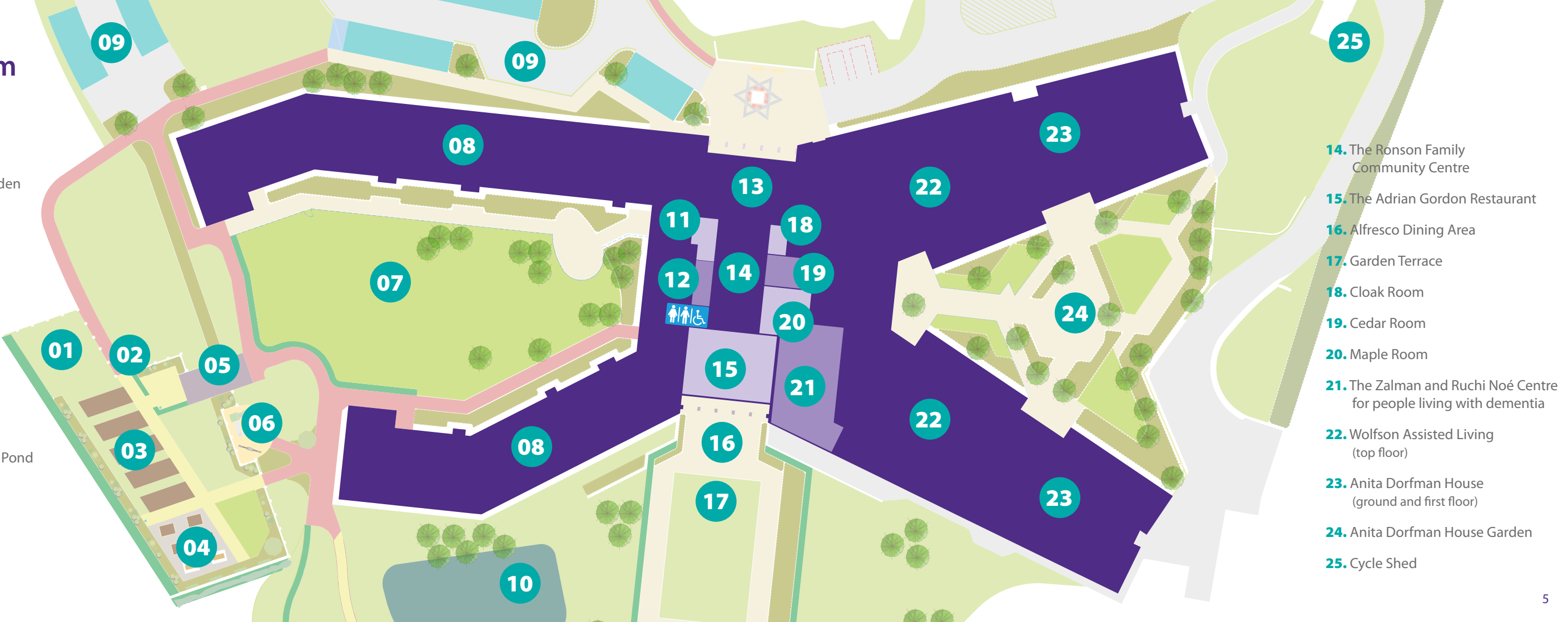
The community centre links Anita Dorfman House care home and Wolfson Assisted Living on one side with Pears Court Retirement Living apartments on the other, each with its own dedicated entrance from the central foyer.

Outside, you can enjoy Piaf's Garden with its accessible pathways, a tranquil lake with viewing decks, a secluded walled garden, a horticultural centre, and a children's play area for visiting families.

The Ronson Family Community Centre

At the heart of Sandringham is a vibrant Jewish community, welcoming people of all ages and not only those who live on campus.

The Ronson Family Community Centre hosts many of Sandringham's social and cultural activities. With its own reception, activity room and multifunctional space, it connects the care home, assisted living, retirement living and day services, creating a natural hub for everyone on site.

The centre hosts a wide range of community groups, offering opportunities to connect, socialise and support one another. From Bridge and Chatty Café to Chaps that Chat and the Jewish Bereavement Counselling Service's Peace of Mind bereavement group, there is something for everyone. These groups bring residents, tenants and community members together, creating meaningful opportunities to meet new people and socialise.

There are also many lively and varied activities for all interests, including art groups, bingo, guest speakers and themed days, along with celebrations

for festivals and special occasions. From summer BBQs to community seders and Chanukah salt beef lunches, the centre provides rich cultural and religious experiences that foster connection and belonging.

The community programme runs for anyone over 65, Monday to Thursday, 10am–3pm. To find out more, pick up a calendar in reception.

A Jewish Care minibus may be available for members who need additional help with transportation.*

GROUPS FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH DEMENTIA

Singing for Memory is a singing session providing a stimulating social environment, and bringing together people who are living with conditions that affect memory and their carers.

The Memory Way Café is a group for carers, together with their friend or family members living with dementia, to enjoy activities and socialise.

Sessions include guest speakers and professionals offering advice and coping strategies.

We also have special **Carers' Teas** for those caring for people living with dementia, so you can get together with others who understand what you may be going through.

THE ADRIAN GORDON RESTAURANT

A vibrant, welcoming space for all visitors, offering a wide selection of fresh salads, sandwiches and hot meals.

With beautiful views of the landscaped grounds, it's the perfect place to relax and catch up with family and friends.

Enjoy a choice of tasty meals, tea and coffee, plus homemade cakes and pastries. Indoor and outdoor seating is available, along with takeaway options.



The restaurant is open Sunday to Friday, serving a delicious daytime dairy menu with parev options.

HALL HIRE

Our spacious main hall is available for communal use and private hire. It offers a bright, flexible setting ideal for events, celebrations, meetings and community activities.

ACCESSIBILITY

The entire site is fully accessible for wheelchair users, with extra-wide disabled parking bays close to the entrance and automatic doors at the main and rear access points. A beautifully landscaped central courtyard and accessible pathways throughout the campus ensure everyone can enjoy our surroundings.



JC EXPLORE

Jewish Care Explore exists to offer support with technology to all adults within the Jewish community.

We have a dedicated centre here in Sandringham with equipment available for people to use independently or with support from staff. Help and advice is also available, offering guidance on everything from adjusting phone settings to specialist assistive technology.

We provide remote support over the phone, and technology courses on

subjects including iPads, laptops and video calls to help people feel more comfortable and independent with the technology they are using.

JC Explore also works with Jewish Care tenants, residents and service users to help them join online activities and to make digital content more accessible. Join the JC Explore mailing list by scanning the QR code.

The Zalman and Ruchi Noé Centre for people living with dementia

For people who are living with memory impairment, or who have been diagnosed with a form of dementia

The Zalman and Ruchi Noé Centre for people living with dementia is located away from the main hustle and bustle of the day centre. The warm and friendly centre offers a programme of activities and care for people living with dementia, to enhance their overall wellbeing and provide support for their families and carers.

Our professional team works in close partnership with trained volunteers, helping to offer a stimulating and welcoming environment for members to enjoy. Each client receives their individual care plans as part of the referral and assessment process.

In addition to a range of stimulating and therapeutic activities, centre members will enjoy a hot, kosher meal on site. Members celebrate the Jewish festivals and traditions and have the opportunity to continue pastimes they enjoy, as well as taking part in new activities.

Referrals

Referrals can be made directly by families, social workers, care managers, GPs and hospitals.

The Centre is open Monday to Thursday, 9:30am–3pm

Social Work and Community Services

Support for older people and anyone experiencing memory loss or living with a dementia diagnosis.

DISABILITY AND WELFARE RIGHTS

Helping adults of all ages live as independently as possible, including arranging useful equipment for the home.

FAMILY CARERS

Practical and emotional support for those caring for a family member, friend or neighbour affected by frailty, dementia, disability or a life-limiting illness.

END OF LIFE

Working closely with individuals and families to ensure end-of-life choices are made with dignity and respect.

SOCIAL WORK SURGERIES

The monthly social work drop-in at Sandringham offers on-site support, including personalised guidance, advocacy with authorities, future care planning and emotional assistance for carers.

Pears Court

Retirement Living with Jewish Care offers individuals and couples over the age of 60 the freedom to live in style, with the peace of mind of knowing 24-hour support is available, with staff based on site if needed.

Living in Pears Court gives you the opportunity to be involved in a thriving Jewish community, with many volunteering opportunities for those who are looking to be actively involved.



There are 48 one and two-bedroom apartments to rent, with access to shared facilities including:

- A communal courtyard and garden
- A guest suite for visitors to use when staying over (bookable in advance, cost applies)
- A choice of communal lounges for relaxation and entertainment
- A hairdressing salon
- 24-hour on-site support from a dedicated team
- An on-site management team
- Supervised kosher in community centre
- A shop selling essentials, groceries and kosher meals
- Support from the maintenance team
- Wi-Fi in communal areas
- Video phone entry system
- A mobility scooter park
- Two lifts (including a Shabbat lift)
- Synagogue support from a dedicated team
- Concierge service
- Laundry facilities

Each luxury Pears Court apartment features a beautifully designed open-plan fitted kitchen and a spacious lounge, along with a fully tiled wet room and a private balcony overlooking the landscaped courtyard garden or surrounding woodland.

Pears court has direct access to The Ronson Family Community Centre, offering a wide range of activities, an on-site synagogue, kosher restaurant, hair salon and wellbeing centre, all for the enjoyment of Pears Court tenants, as well as other members of the community.

Tenants can also relax or socialise in the bright, modern communal lounge. Accessible pathways throughout the development make it easy for everyone to enjoy the surroundings, with a variety of indoor and outdoor activities available, plus a weekly shuttle bus to local shops and other destinations.



All apartments are available to rent. We recommend seeking independent financial advice to help you decide what's best for you.

Your safety and security are paramount. Pears Court features secure entry systems, CCTV, 24/7 on-site security, a concierge service, and each apartment is equipped with an advanced emergency call system, smoke and heat detectors, and a carbon monoxide alarm.

Anita Dorfman House

Anita Dorfman House offers a warm, modern Jewish home where exceptional care and community come together. With 64 en-suite rooms arranged in four small households, residents enjoy a friendly, familiar atmosphere and personal support.

Jewish life is central here. Regular synagogue services, Shabbat, festivals and cultural activities create a strong sense of belonging, with an on-site synagogue providing a peaceful space for prayer and reflection.

Each household has welcoming dining and lounge areas serving delicious kosher meals, alongside cosy spaces for time with family and a beautiful courtyard for fresh air and relaxation.

Registered with the CQC, the home provides high-quality residential, nursing, dementia and end-of-life care—ensuring every resident lives with comfort, dignity and purpose in a place that feels like home.

Wolfson Assisted Living, part of Anita Dorfman House, offers a unique hybrid model designed for people who want the reassurance of support while maintaining a greater sense of independence and privacy than a traditional care home can provide.

Residents enjoy a spacious, self-contained suite with their own living area, kitchenette and private balcony. This layout provides more room to relax, host visitors, and maintain personal routines, creating a home that feels like their own.

Daily life is made easier with regular meals, housekeeping, tailored activity programmes, and personalised care plans. With 24/7 access to care staff, residents benefit from continuous safety and peace of mind without compromising independence.

Wolfson Assisted Living also offers full use of the care home's facilities, from cosy lounges to fun activities, as well as the use of Sandringham's wider facilities. Residents are free to participate in as much or as little of the community life as they choose.

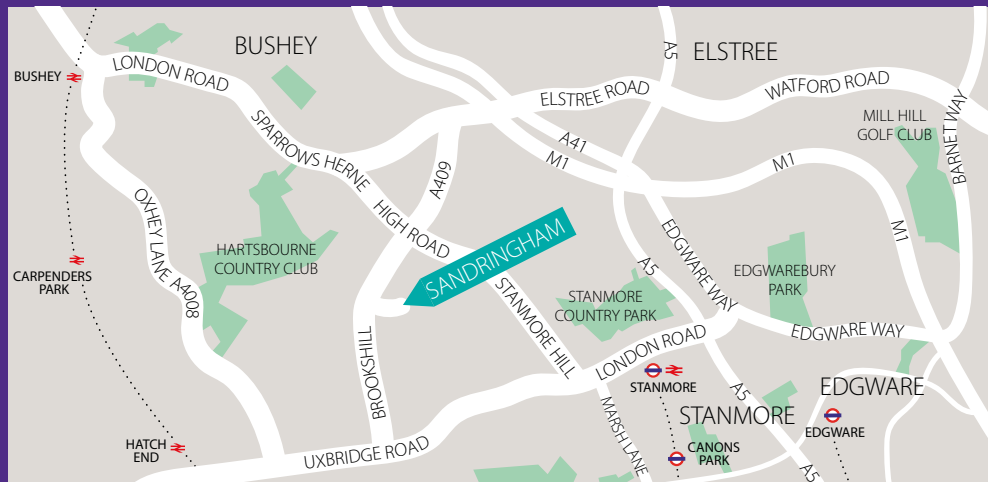
Jewish Care Direct
